Estimated time from Pre- Launch meeting to First P7 Meeting 4 weeks

Pre Launch Meeting

Sunday September 11^h 4:30 PM

Goals:

1. Obtain all *missionaries* contact information
2. Encourage P7 *missionaries* to begin looking for peer and faculty connections
3. Connect with P7 and the GYD via Facebook, YouTube, Instagram and Twitter
4. Hand out all needed P7 documentation

Back to school Rally/ P7 launch

Sunday September 18th

Goals:

1. P7 presentation
2. Build momentum; encourage *missionaries* that this is their church and their work
3. Start two-week check list

WEEK ONE

Day 1-2

Obtain signatures of peers and fellow missionaries seeking to be involved.

Day 2-3

Gain commitment of P7 home room teacher for meetings once a week or once every 2 weeks.

Determine which executive faculty member to see and set appointment.

WEEK TWO

Day 1-5

Present P7 documents to executive faculty member. Establish P7 as an endorsed school club.

Thursday September 29th

Goals:

1. Establish meeting times as well as responsibilities.
 - Lesson planning
 - Attendance
 - Promotion
 - Snacks if applicable
2. Review expectations
 - Expect to sacrifice
 - Expect the possibility of being the only ones at the club meet
 - Expect Resistance
 - Expect responsibility
 - Expect to have to communicate
 - Expect to be empowered
 - Expect to use integrity
 - Expect to be a leader
 - Expect to build relationships and community
3. Set goals (4 goals per group, 3 are to predetermined by us)
 - Promotional goals
 - Outreach goals
 - Retention goals (Attract, win, retain)

P7/CYM DIRECTOR RESPONSIBILITIES

Daily:

1. support in prayer

Weekly:

1. 2 points of contact per week
 - a. Sunday 5pm to go over lesson for the week help with any questions and creative ideas
 - b. Night before P7 Meeting (Call/Text)
2. Weekly accountability of goals and responsibilities

Monthly:

1. Month in review meeting (talking points: how can I help you, what do we need to do to reach your goals?)
2. Monthly conference calls with experienced p7 or equivalent groups (i.e. Spencer Jordan, Taylor Arthur, p7 leaders, Blake Soto)

Semester:
